The Worlds We Create!





Learners are introduced to various story elements, using examples from FATTY LEGS, A STRANGER AT HOME, WHEN I WAS EIGHT, and NOT MY GIRL, as well as through other popular books and TV shows, and movies. With prompts and guidance, they practice identifying and creating these elements themselves. Finally, learners explore various imagination-generating tools to create the elements required for storytelling, while learning to listen to and voice the stories that emerge from the elements. - Create stories using a pick-a-path scaffold for guidance
- Create stories with story decks

- Intro to figurative language
- Identify types of figurative language used with examples from the works about Olemaun Pokiak
- Use a Mad Lib-style worksheet to create beautiful language
- Create sentences that demonstrate the use of figurative language
